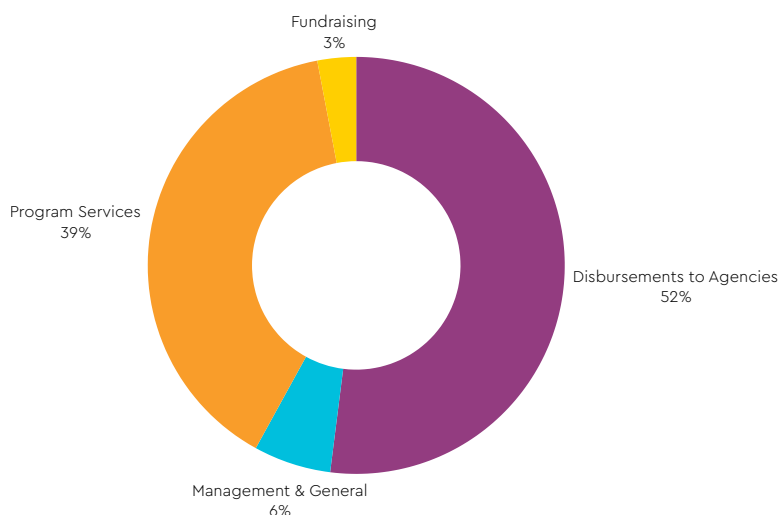

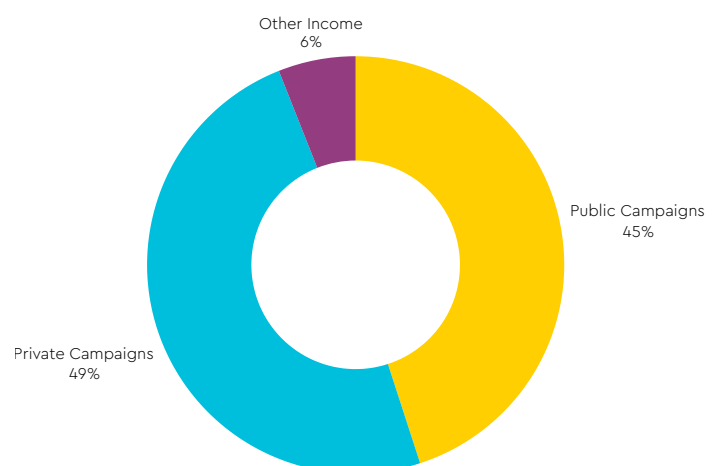
2024-25 Expenses
